Seasons

I am writing this article on New Year's Day, a wet and windy day, thinking about Christmas a week ago and all the celebrations enjoyed with others. It is lovely to see Christmas decorations and an array of coloured lights as I walk Monty around the village.

I was asked earlier in the week when should the Christmas tree and decorations come down. There are many different answers. For me the Christmas tree is dismantled after twelfth night - Epiphany (a moment of sudden realisation, in the church specifically a showing of Jesus Christ to the Magi, God had come to earth for everyone not just the Jews) - on the 6th January. However, the crib stays up until the 2nd February - the festival of Presentation of Jesus in the Temple, which is the end of the Christmas season in the church.

There is such a build up to Christmas with carol services, Christingle, school nativities, offering worship, tradition and fellowship. It is over so quickly. The Church allows us a few weeks more for reflection about God's Son coming amongst us, being human and divine, living a life showing us of God's love for all of his creation.

The next major season will be Lent beginning with Ash Wednesday on the 5th March. Forty days of reflection leading to Palm Sunday, Holy Week and culminating on the 20th April, Easter Day this year. The date for Easter moves each year because it is set by the phases of the moon and is related to the meal, Passover, that Jesus celebrated with his friends the night before he was arrested. The celebration of Easter occurs after the first full moon following the Spring equinox and will fall between March 22nd and the 25th April.

I pray that you may know that God is present in your life also his love, in everything you are, do and say.

May God bless you.

Our Christmas dinner included home grown carrots, swede, broccoli cauliflower and potatoes so we considered that a success and delicious!

We look forward to another growing year and planning what we will grow and where. Adding well rotted manure will improve the soil and give better results, you cannot keep taking without replacing the nutrients.

Gardening can be a healthy activity for life if you are sensible with your physical capabilities.

5 handy tips for gardeners of any age

- 1. Think before you bend, hinge from the hips and allow your ankles to flex especially when lifting. If you can, squatting can be comfortable for long periods and is a great way to maintain lower body flexibility.
- 2. Variety, Digging is hard labour and long periods of this can cause repetitive strain injures and back pain. Break up the task by choosing lighter jobs that use different muscle groups.
- 3. Be aware of tension in your neck, the Alexander Technique teaches you how to keep your head balanced and poised on top of your spine. A contracted neck and hunched shoulders interfere with natural posture and can also impact balance.
- 4. Organise your shed, replan your storage to reduce any unnecessary twisting, turning or lifting heavy bulky items such as lawnmowers.
- 5. Have a lie down or active rest this will release any tension that has built up whilst gardening.

Minutes of proceedings of a council and of its committees must be kept. They are intended to be formal records of official acts and decisions, not reports, still less verbatim reports of speeches.

Planning applications received after agenda publication will be dealt with owing to a 21 day limit on the council responding to consultations from the Planning Authority. The parish council is only a consultee, and does not determine applications.

Residents can make representations in writing to the clerk or in person during the public session held at the start of a meeting. Please note in accordance with Council Standing Order 3(h) a question shall not give rise to a debate or require an immediate response

What do you know about Orchids? Not much, but after our September meeting, we all knew a lot more! Our speaker for the evening was Saul Walker, Vice-Chairman of the Devon Orchid Society. Saul is also Head Gardener at Stonelands House, Dawlish. He has an impressive list of qualifications and experience, including a passion for orchids stretching over 25-30 years, and helping to build Orchid stands at the Chelsea Flower Shows.

There are 27,000 species of orchids world wide, many of which are the most tolerant of house plants. There are 3 main temperature zones for orchids – Cool – minimum 12° C; Intermediate – $16 - 24^{\circ}$ C and Warm – $19 - 29^{\circ}$ C. Don't put your orchids on top of a radiator, or in direct sunlight which will burn the leaves.

Saul gave us a most interesting and informative talk, and those members who had orchids found the evening very beneficial. He brought with him a number of different types of orchids, supplied by Burnham Nurseries at Newton Abbot. Saul is a very good speaker, and I have a list of his other talks – if anyone would like to book him for their club/society then let me know and I'll give you the details.

"Devon Orchards and how Devon took to Cider" was the title of an interesting and well-illustrated talk by Michael Gee at our October meeting, which told us the history of orchards in Devon. The only native apple is the crab apple, with all other varieties originating from Asia. The earliest apple trees were grown in the medieval period, but were probably not orchards as we know them today. Henry VIII, encouraged by Catherine of Aragon, promoted fruit growing and cider caught on as a drink that lasted longer than home brewed ale.







A diary from 1787 recording apple trees at Buckland Manor, Braunton included 10% of Devon apples: Tom Putt, Lucombe and Brown-eyed Pippin. The rest were from Herefordshire. Competition has seen a marked decline in Devon orchards since the second world war, but the introduction of

more specialised and professional fruit growing has seen a resurgence.

White Lightning was developed in Winkleigh by Inch's Cider and proved hugely successful. Inch's was bought by Bulmer's (now owned by Heineken) and production moved to Herefordshire although a proportion of their apples are still grown in Devon. There was far too much information in this talk to be reproduced here!

Typically, we start at childhood and move through key events life events, but if there are specific things you'd like to talk about, we'd love to hear it! The chats are audio recorded, transcribed and added to an online collection for everyone to enjoy.

As part of the project, the library also runs a free 'Drop In' on the first Tuesday morning of each month. People can drop by for a chat and a good reminisce. There is usually a set theme to get us started, but conversations can veer off anywhere!



Update from Cllr Peter Jones Your Independent District Councillor—January 2025

Happy New Year to you all! I hope you have had a wonderful Christmas!

Please see my latest update as your District Councillor.

The New Development and New Affordable Homes

The development has progressed, and the first of the affordable homes and shared ownership properties have been made available. Those eligible can bid until the 20th of January on the Devon Homes Choice website. The first release includes 12 rented units, including 1 x 2-bed house and 3 x 3-bed houses for affordable rent, as well as 3 x 1-bed houses and 5 x 2-bed houses for social rent. More properties will be released throughout the year.

106 Projects

I'm pleased to share that applications are now being submitted for the 106 community fund, which is the money available from the development. An application has been submitted for updates to the village hall, and plans are underway for a multi-surface sports pitch on the sports field. Additionally, the £15,500 contribution from Allison Homes has been distributed to various community groups. I am also delighted to confirm that a further £15,500 will be available from L&G Affordable Homes this spring.

Buses

The bus service continues to fail our community despite the hard work of many within the community to highlight the issues. Despite petitions and efforts to engage the council and Stagecoach, no real improvements have been made. We must continue to highlight these issues, so please keep reporting onto the Facebook group log. Thank you to everyone who has contributed their time so far.

Community Events

2024 saw many wonderful community events. St. John's Fair made a triumphant return, and we welcomed the creation of a new farmers' market.

Almost every weekend, there are activities bringing people together, thanks to the tireless efforts of those who volunteer their time to make our community a better place.

Let's not forget the hard work of our parish council's and various committees, who often undertake tough, thankless roles. To everyone who plays a part in supporting our communities—thank you.

Policy Development Work

Through my work with the Policy Development Committee, I've been proud to take part in three public hearings over the last year:

Dentistry Provision in North Devon:

We addressed the critical issue of failing dental services. I'm pleased to report that our MP Ian Room is leading an action group with regional experts to drive change on this issue.

Supporting the Rural Economy:

We explored ways to better support our farming sector and rural economy. This has led to changes in planning processes, including free pre-application advice and faster processing for projects tied to grant applications, such as slurry pit coverings.

Water Quality in North Devon:

Improving the quality of our rivers and beaches remains a passion of mine. Alongside local citizen scientists, we are testing the Little Dart catchment and working to establish a North Devon group to monitor water quality across the region. I continue to lobby for year-round water monitoring on beaches and rivers and was proud to join the March for Clean Water in London this October with my family.

Peter Jones—District Councillor Update. (continued) Looking Ahead

Devolution:

We are entering an interesting period for local politics. The new Government has released a plan that will likely see a restructuring of the current two-tier system, merging district councils into larger unitary authorities. It's highly likely that I will be your last District Councillor and that there are unlikely to be county council elections as planned in May.

During my time as a councillor, I've seen how effectively North Devon Council manages services for our communities. I worry that larger, more centralised councils will move services further from local communities, with a negative impact on responsiveness and quality. I'll continue to monitor developments and keep you informed.

Planning:

The government is also introducing significant changes to planning regulations, with housing targets nearly doubling in many areas. This makes it more challenging for communities to maintain a five-year supply of development land, which could lead to an increase in unwanted, speculative applications—like the one recently seen in Witheridge. I'll be watching these changes closely and will update you as the situation develops.

Witheridge Parish Council Winter Report January 2025

I will begin with an update on the children's playgrounds. Firstly governance update on the Tots playground. It is good news; the Parish Hall committee have agreed to lease the land containing the playground to the Parish Council for ninety nine years at a peppercorn rent. Once the solicitors have drawn up the lease the council can then carry out the agreed replacement of the damaged Springer, and erect bow topped railings around the site with new gates incorporating a disabled access. The existing entry is rutted and the council have accepted a quotation from our grounds maintenance company to rectify the problem as soon as is possible.

At the adventure playground the council is aware that the existing skate ramps need welding repairs. Two contractors have been sourced however welder A has been somewhat reticent with providing a revised quotation. Council agreed that a further attempt be made to contact A, failing this to proceed to ask B to quote.

It was agreed at our October meeting, and a contractor chosen, to tarmac the existing footpath through the playground. The existing stone will be cleared and 20mm of porous tarmac laid. The original so called "self binding stone" certainly wasn't, and would have involved the council in costly maintenance. At the time of agreeing the contract no caveats were given as to any required maintenance, had they been disclosed the gravel medium would not have been chosen. The contractor has given a date of this January to carry out the work.

The Parish council have still not taken ownership of the green space bordering the playground as the land has not been restored to the agreed requirements of the 106 agreement. However once this commitment is completed by Allison Homes, the council's solicitor will proceed to exchange documents and the Parish council take ownership and the ongoing maintenance.

There seems to be a bewildering amount of road closures and diversions in our neighbourhood some of which appear to have no activity during the closure period also very poor signage.

Parish Council report-continued.

Recently there was a burst water main beyond Witheridge but the road was closed at Tiverton Long Drag .Surely the sign should have been explicit as to where the road was closed saving residents a long diversion? There is a county website with an overlaid map where any future road closures can be viewed online at https://devon.roadworks.org or there is a link on our website contacts page and accessible on DCC highways. One to add to your diary is Newbridge just out of Witheridge towards South Molton. That is scheduled for closure from the 21st July until the 5th September. Both the walls and foundations are crumbling.

At the January meeting, a quotation was accepted to replace the rotting bench at the end of Lakelands Close with a new one.

In December the council were consulted by representatives from South West Care Homes who are proposing to add another twelve en suite rooms at the rear of the existing Firs care Home. The home is an asset to the village as residents who feel they can no longer cope with living in their own homes can opt for care at the Firs but still be in a familiar environment and still meet up with friends. When the question was asked of the representatives "would Witheridge residents be given priority for care? The answer was an unequivocal, yes they would. Formal plans are to be submitted sometime this month.

The Finance subcommittee suggested budget for Witheridge council 2025/2026 was approved in December by full council .All councillors were in favour of a budget of £60,000 and setting a precept of £43,000 with the difference being funded from our general reserve. This results in no tax increase to residents.

Currently Witheridge only has one public defibrillator accessible in the Square. Given the growth of the village the Parish council has identified additional requirements and would like to locate a second at the bottom of the new development. We have the agreement of the Medical Centre to mount a new defib/code cabinet and electrical installation requirements.

Parish Council report-continued.

We have costings for the cabinet and support charge with Community Heartbeat foundation our current provider, and wiring costs. We have submitted an application to Legal and general Partnership Fund to support this cost to serve the extended community at Juniper Way, Broomhouse Park and Cannington Road.

The format of the Parish Council Meetings has changed slightly. They now commence at 7pm and for the first half hour reports are received from Mr. J.Yabsley our County Councillor and Mr. P. Jones our District Councillor and Councillor S. Smith who is the Parish Councils police advocate. Questions can then be put to them by the public and councillors alike during the public session and also questions which are specific to the Parish council. These are restricted to three minutes.

We move on then to the council session during which there is no public participation.

The Christmas tree in the square provided by the Parish council, this year, was funded by Allison Homes partnership fund. I for one was very disappointed that the forecast storm put paid to all the festivities organised by St. John's Fair committee at our annual "switch on" event. Hopefully Next Year?

WITHERIDGE ASTRONOMICAL SOCIETY

February and hopefully clear, dark skies will abound. The constellation Taurus can be seen in the south from about 10pm. Taurus, the Bull, has a distinctive 'V' shaped group of stars forming the head. This group is called the Hyades. The bright red star, Aldebaran, forms the eye of the bull. Twice as near to us as the remaining stars of the Hyades, Aldebaran is just 68 light years away from us, about 40 times the diameter of the Sun and 100 times as bright.

To the upper right of Taurus lie the Pleiades, an open cluster of stars which, through a telescope or binoculars, seem to be a little fuzzy which is caused by the stars passing through a cloud of carbon grains.

March sees the onset of spring and the promise of slightly warmer evenings. The old favourite, Orion, is sinking towards the west to be replaced by the constellation Leo. Leo can be discerned by its distinctive 'backwards question mark' forming the head and shoulders of the Lion. Leo is one of the oldest constellations being recognised by many different cultures and people including people in Persia, India, Turkey and the Levant, all of whom recognised the shape of a sitting Lion.

Just before we say goodbye to Orion look below and to the left to see a really bright star. This is Sirius which is only 8.7 light years away and shines 23 times as brightly as the Sun.

Moving to April the highlight of the month has to be the Lyrid meteor shower. This will be on the night of the $22^{nd}/23^{rd}$ April. It is a short shower lasting less than a day but is eastly seen with the naked eye. This month there could well be a good number of fireballs, bright shooting stars streaking across the sky and possibly leaving a trail lasting for 30 seconds or more.

Before leaving April two events worth looking out for. One is the Moon making its way through the Pleiades occulting many of the stars in its path. This will be on the 1st April at about 10.30pm. The other sight to observe is the planet Mars almost due south of the Moon and one Moon's width away, this will be on the 5th April.

We've had a very traumatic last few weeks. On Boxing Day Wolfie arrived at "dinner time" with a nasty eye injury and so had an emergency vet visit. Wolfie had a serious puncture wound to his left eye that had penetrated through almost all the layers of the cornea. Thankfully he is a very good patient which has meant that we have been able to treat him at home and not have to send him off to hospital. He has been having 6 sets of eye drops a day since then in an effort to save his eye and sight. He is still having weekly vet visits to ensure the eye heals as best it can. We suspect blackthorn was the culprit.

Even more tragically, on the evening of the 27th December Rocky started showing early signs of colic. We had 3 vet visits over 24 hours. Despite all initial signs having been promising, as time went on it became clear that we weren't winning. We were in the realms of rare, unusual and complex conditions that we wouldn't be unable to fix...and so we had to say goodbye. Rocky was such an incredibly important member of the herd, and a great friend to me. An excellent communicator he ensured the smooth running of everything with the

herd and he is a huge loss to us all. I had known Rocky for 17 years and he was such an important part of me too.

Thank you to everyone who attended and helped at our For The Love of Animals event at the Quince Honey Farm in November. We were overwhelmed with



the response from North Devon who turned out in support of the 11 animal rescue organisations who attended and supported the event. There was such a great response from the venue, the visitors, and the rescues that everyone is keen for the event to run again in 2025.

We have no further news about our search for land - only that we are definitely losing our location and efforts so far have not yielded any results. There are 3 pony sanctuaries in Devon losing their land. Nationally I know of another 3 animals rescues in the same situation. It's not an easy situation to resolve.

We are booked to hold our plant sale and dog show at Witheridge Parish Hall on May 18th 2025.
